# RECTOR'S RAMBLINGS

---

## The Year of Jubilee

Queen Elizabeth II has reached the phenomenal achievement of reaching her platinum Jubilee - 70 years of reign. Of course there are parties and celebrations and church services, and rightly so!



Many of us find ourselves reflecting on the character of the Queen. Across a very long reign she has never forgotten that her position gives her responsibility before the privilege which she also enjoys. In this she has been exemplary. But how do you really mark the achievement of such a reign?

The concept of Jubilee is a Biblical one, and even our word Jubilee derived from the Hebrew yovel, which was the trumpet by which a jubilee year was announced. Leviticus 25 commands that every fiftieth year should be a jubilee - a year of rest for people and the land, and most importantly, a year for cancelling debts, freeing slaves and returning land to its original, ancestral owners. It is an extraordinary idea. The land is not ours but God's, which God wants to benefit all, not a privileged few.

A young nation was encouraged to work hard and reap the rewards, but those who had fallen on hard times should not be trapped in historic debt - they should have a periodic fresh start. Sadly there is no evidence that the Biblical command was ever put into practice, despite its wise balancing of the different aspects of what we see as 'fair'.

A little over 20 years ago churches were at the forefront of the Jubilee 2000 campaign, which secured the cancellation of \$100billion developing world national debts - enabling those countries to help themselves instead of servicing debts to first world countries. This was perhaps the first time that a 3000 year old biblical idea had been taken seriously.

As we celebrate the Queen's jubilee, and a long period of relative peace and freedom, this is also a time to consider what makes for peace and freedom. Forgiveness and mercy are perhaps two of the qualities most needed in forging long term peace and freedom. What do you think?

## WAS JESUS POLITICAL?

---



In his Easter Day sermon, the Archbishop of Canterbury condemned our government's proposal to despatch would-be immigrants to Rwanda. This inevitably raised the hoary question of religion and politics and, more particularly in this case, Christianity and politics. Many suppose that they are separate and that archbishops or anyone else for that matter has no right to interfere in politics. Well, apart from the fact that the Church of England is by law established and that senior bishops have a seat in the House of Lords, where they are expected to advise the government of the day; both religion and politics are concerned with how we humans live together. Moreover, Christianity has a great deal to do with politics!

Was Jesus himself politically minded? He certainly didn't align himself with one of the party of his day and many would say he was not political and go on to quote his words to Pontius Pilate: "My kingdom is not of this world" and understand by that Jesus' kingdom had nothing to do with being an earthly kingdom; but, was something "spiritual." However, the Greek doesn't say "of this world", as translated in the King James Version, but "from" this world, that is, his kingdom was not one using the methods of the world to establish itself. Rome used those methods. Military conquest with its violence and bloodshed was used to establish control. After that, where there were puppet kings and rulers, they were expected to maintain order and ensure that taxes were paid. Where the emperor ruled directly through a governor, as with Judaea from A.D.6-66, order was strictly and often brutally maintained. In contrast, Jesus' kingdom was founded on love and God loved the world so much that he sent his Son to save it! Hence Jesus taught his followers to pray, "Your kingdom come, your will be done on earth . . . ." No one could deny the political implications of this with its

talk of Jesus or the Father having a kingdom, albeit, one not using the violence of conquest to establish itself but attracting willing subjects by the suffering love of God shown on the Cross and the love which binds those subjects to one another.

Jesus demanded absolute allegiance to himself as the Father's representative, an allegiance which necessarily challenged Caesar's similar claim. Moreover, Jesus' triumphal entry into Jerusalem on a donkey with its obvious (and presumably intentional) echoes of Zechariah ch.9: "Lo, your king comes to you, triumphant and glorious is he, humble and riding on a donkey" is an explicit claim to kingship, even if he was not the kind of king the people expected the Messiah to be! Again, since the emperors and military leaders entered their capital in triumph, this was an unmistakable challenge to Caesar and therefore political.

Christianity is political! It is, in no small part, about how we live together under God, - the God who has revealed himself in Jesus of Nazareth. The Church, therefore, has much to say to governments about things like compassion, reconciliation, forgiveness - yes, and justice, but the justice of God, which shows compassion and seeks long-term healing for both victim and oppressor. These could, of course, be the aim of different political parties and individual Christians will make their own minds up about that and decide which party comes closest (however far away that may be!)

At election time, apart from reminding voters about the kind of God Jesus revealed and his teaching about his kingdom and the kind of people we should be, religious leaders do well to leave it to the individual, unless a particular party in its manifesto includes a programme which is blatantly contrary to the teaching and example of Jesus in which case there is a duty to speak out! Similarly, when - at any time - the government plans something manifestly unchristian, all Christian ministers have a right to speak out.

# ALDE VALLEY SUFFOLK FAMILY HISTORY GROUP

## **Endell Street: The Trailblazing Women who Ran World War One's Most Remarkable Military Hospital – Wendy Moore**

When the First World War broke out in 1914 dozens of women doctors offered their services – but they were told by the British Army to “Go home and sit still”. Flora Murray and Louisa Garrett Anderson refused to sit still. Both qualified doctors and suffragettes - and also life partners - they took a team of women doctors and nurses to Paris. They ran a hospital there so successfully that the army invited them to open a second hospital in Boulogne and then - in May 1915 - to run a major military hospital in the heart of London. Endell Street was unique. It was the only hospital within the British Army to be staffed by women - all the doctors, nurses and orderlies were female, apart from a dozen or so male helpers. The women of Endell Street treated 24,000 wounded soldiers who were shipped back from the frontline in France, Gallipoli and elsewhere throughout the war. After the war the hospital remained open to treat victims of the 1918 ‘Spanish’ flu pandemic. Endell Street became renowned as the ‘most popular’ hospital in the First World War - but that did nothing to help its women pioneers when peace came.

Louisa Garrett Anderson was the daughter of Elizabeth Garrett Anderson, Mayor of Aldeburgh - the first female mayor and the first female doctor in England. The Garretts were major employers and philanthropists in our immediate area for some two centuries.

Wendy Moore, author of *ENDELL STREET: The Women who ran Britain's Trailblazing Military Hospital*, reveals the startling story of these pioneering women. Wendy is a freelance journalist and the author of five books on medical and social history. *ENDELL STREET* was a BBC Radio 4 Book of the Week.







At our April meeting we paid our yearly membership subscriptions and enjoyed a delicious Jacket potato supper.

Lynda, our President, then asked member Pat Dowding to give her talk on Modern Slavery. Pat's research showed it is a huge worldwide crime, affecting an estimate of 14 million people. Global business with its supply chains drives it. Where there is conflict and poverty there are people who are vulnerable to being tricked into slavery or tricked into selling their children to these criminal gangs of traffickers. It is more lucrative than drug smuggling. We in the developed world may be buying products (clothing, phones, electronics) or using services (car washes, nailbars, cleaners) which come about through Modern Slavery. It is hidden in plain sight, in towns and rural areas. Police and local authorities are trying to educate the public to be aware of this crime. We should keep an eye out for signs that a person maybe caught in this situation. They may be reluctant

to interact, seem fearful, withdrawn, have no personal ID or appropriate clothing for the weather or job they are doing. If suspicions are raised that this person may be in trouble, direct confrontation is not advised for it may put that person in danger - contacting the appropriate authorities such as the Modern Slavery Helpline, Crimestoppers or the police with your concerns is better. Suffolk Constabulary are working with local businesses and communities to raise awareness and to work closely with potential victims to give advice and support in getting free from their enslavers.

We thanked Pat for sharing what she has learned about this topic that touches all our lives.

Our June meeting will be on the 15th at 7.15pm. David Burgess will talk on 'Nurses and Nursing'. Quite relevant for our times! All welcome.





## UPDATE FROM STOP SIZEWELL C

The Sizewell C planning decision is now delayed until 8 July (from 25 May) *“to ensure there is sufficient time to fully consider further information provided by the applicant and interested parties”*. Our view is that this six-week delay recognises the range and complexity of outstanding issues, but announcing a delay so soon after nuclear was placed front and centre of the new Energy Strategy was no doubt a little awkward for the government.

On 15 May, in anticipation of a decision soon afterwards, Stop Sizewell and Together Against Sizewell C organised a protest march and rally. Thank you to everyone who took part. There was a fantastic atmosphere and great speakers including Adrian Ramsay, co leader of the Green Party and District Councillors Louise Gooch and David Beavan. There was coverage in The Independent, on Bloomberg and in multiple local media.


