

Rector's Ramblings



Dippy on Tour

I recently went with my family to see Dippy the Diplodocus in Norwich Cathedral. He's still there if you're interested. Entry is free, and the cathedral is great to visit — well organised for visitors, with decent loos and refectory and helpful displays.

The exhibition took the opportunity to talk not only about this diplodocus and


other dinosaurs, but also about extinction, and climate change — the end of the dinosaurs was of course a consequence of climate change — an ice age, as well as a meteorite.

One of the things that came to mind readily was the meeting of science and religion. Nine hundred years ago, when the cathedral was built, dinosaurs were unheard of, and the priesthood was the centre of learning, education and development. Six hundred years later, the Enlightenment gradually questioned established orders of learning and understanding and the role of the church diminished — appropriately. It is sad that as science developed too many Christians saw it as an attack on faith and sought to discredit it. It is sad too that some scientists, past and present, have seen their discoveries and theories as a way of disposing of religion as so much outdated thought.

Both parties made the same mistake, to suppose that faith and science were in opposition. They are not. Long before ordination I got a biochemistry degree. I am a scientist at heart. The priest who trained me is a chemist. Please throw away the argument that science disproves faith!

Rather, they offer different perspectives on the world, just as Shakespeare's work is not devalued because of Einstein's. So, where science offers physical, chemical, biological explanations of the world Christianity looks from a different angle - that of our relationships with God and with each other (that is to say, love); and through that, looks at our sense of meaning.

For example, evolution might offer a mechanism for the origin of species, but could have been used by a creative, loving God. Indeed, it is creation in which we often see the debates start. The account of the seven-day creation of Genesis was never trying to be scientific! Instead, it debated with the (long gone) faiths of Israel's neighbour countries, and asserted that there was *only one God*; that God was good, not violent or tyrannical; and it



suggested that God had a serious grown-up *purpose* for humankind, rather than slavery, as neighbour countries believed. The Christian faith seeks *truth* and *love* in response to the Bible's account of a loving God.

I might say that God is pro-science because science is a quest for truth. But that truth must be used lovingly and responsibly or else it is open to abuse. The climate change crisis highlighted by Norwich cathedral's exhibition must be met with truth, but also the responsible love to do something about it. Now more than ever we need faith and science working together to shape our future. Can we let science and faith be friends, please?

The Ultimate Future - "Nothing-ness" or Glory?

Recently the physicist Professor Brian Cox gave a series of programmes on television entitled "Adventures in space and time". He is a brilliant teacher and rightly popular, explaining, as he does, abstruse concepts clearly and in a homely way and with a broad smile. However, as with many scientists today he does sometimes inadvertently drift into the realm of philosophy. In an age in which the scientist is revered as the authority in so many areas, his philosophical statements are almost certainly understood by many viewers as science and therefore authoritative.

Professor Cox frequently talked of the "tragedy of human life", by which he meant the ultimate tragedy of human life. That is a philosophical statement, not to say a theological one. Of course, there is tragedy in human life, and whether it is ultimately a tragedy is a question - but not a scientific question! Brian Cox spoke of the universe tending towards ever greater disorder, until ultimately all will turn to dust and then evaporate, leaving absolutely nothing behind. There will be no atom of matter left. "Nothing happens," he said, "and keeps on happening for ever." There will be nothing existing: all human achievements; all our thoughts, loves, and hope will be as though they had never been, "No imprint of ourselves at all!" As he told us this, Brian Cox had a broad grin on his face because, he told us, he found it funny! Not many would agree with him. In any case, to predict the future is always a risky business. We can say what will probably happen, given the present state of our knowledge and understanding. But how often the improbable happens! How improbable was it that the Big Bang would result in a cosmos which would eventually evolve to produce beings of understanding and creative ability such as Einstein, Shakespeare, Mozart, or Brian Cox himself?

Certainly, Christians have to disagree profoundly with the bleak picture left us by Professor Cox. To start with, we believe this universe has meaning and purpose. Moreover, as I wrote back in my article “Easter – Unique and Cosmic”, Christians celebrate something unique in human history. We equally celebrate something new in the history of the universe: the resurrection of Jesus, which inaugurated a new era. From that time on, the world has been different. There has been a new factor at work, not only in the story of mankind, but in the story of the universe itself. As the scientists tell us, the universe has a fundamental and irreversible movement from order to disorder (e.g. you can’t unscramble eggs!). This results in the decay and death of everything in due course. In the resurrection of Jesus, this movement towards disorder and decay was contradicted. Out of disorder came order, and out of death came life. This is the New Creation which Jesus, who had died, inaugurated on the first Easter Day when he rose from the dead. Of that new creation he is himself both Lord and King.

We are not destined to nothingness, but to glory. This is the meaning of human life. This is WHY we are here. HOW we got here, given the Big Bang, is for science to tell us. It answers what is essentially a scientific question. WHY we are here at all is a question which scientists cannot answer. It has to do with the meaning of human life and the meaning of the universe. These cannot be found within the universe itself. The meaning of anything lies outside that thing itself and is known by seeing how it fits within a wider framework. Thus, the meaning of the universe lies outside the universe. We cannot find it unaided and it lies outside the remit of science. Even philosophers can only speculate. It can only be revealed to us. Christians believe this is exactly what has happened. God has revealed the meaning to us. That revelation is not susceptible to scientific investigation. It has to be taken on trust. It is a matter of faith; but nonetheless real for that. Faith is not opposed to Science. Indeed it is complementary to it. Both are needed. Both are valid – in their respective spheres.

Darsham Parish Council

In the last two meetings, amongst other topics, the Parish Council has concerned itself with the following: parking around the Fox; speeding traffic through the village; the viability of the village's sewage system following recent flooding ; and the environment in the village.

The problem of parking was extensively discussed and the views of some members of the public most affected were heard. Many methods for alleviating the problem had been pursued, including buying land from local land owners, but all to no avail. Sadly, there seems little more we, or the publican, can do, as the very welcome success of the pub inevitably brings extra traffic.

Richard Green volunteered his services to aid the PC in addressing the village environment, an offer which was gratefully accepted. He proposes to publish a newsletter three times a year to "raise awareness, inform and involve" the community in environmental matters. It will be distributed with the *Fisherman*.

Ian Isaac was asked to proceed with the preparations necessary to buy a Speed Awareness Indicator (SID) for the village and the Parish Clerk was asked to write to Anglian Water to express our concern over the adequacy of the sewage system in the village, especially around the Wash.





KATHARINE RICHES (1919-2021)

"Katharine is amazing" was heard constantly and increasingly as those of us in Dunwich who gained such a lot from her presence began to believe in her immortality. Blessed with good health and a clear mind, she lived a long life, active to the end.

Katharine (or Kathleen as she was christened) had had a full life before she came to live permanently in Dunwich. She was born in Lancashire, raised in Staffordshire, and read economics at Cambridge. Her destiny was set when, fruit picking in West Suffolk during a long summer vacation, she was spotted, up a plum tree she told us, by Kenneth Riches whom she married in 1942.

Their married life began in Suffolk, where Kenneth was rector of Bredfield and daughter, Anne, was born. They moved to Oxfordshire two years later where two sons, Peter and Christopher, followed and where they lived until Kenneth became Bishop of Lincoln in 1956. There with three young children Katharine quickly embraced diocesan life, supporting her husband and getting involved locally. She sat on numerous diocesan committees, became a JP, and served on the local Hospital Management Board. As a Lincoln friend commented, "They befriended the great and the good of Lincolnshire whilst holding in special affection the not-so-great and the not-so-good."

It was Dunwich's great good fortune that Kenneth's retirement in 1974 brought them to live in the house at Little Dingle, their holiday retreat since 1955. Katharine embraced village life, and rapidly became part of the fabric of Dunwich. She served as a volunteer and trustee at the museum; was a keen member of the Women's Institute, serving as President for over ten years and attending meetings (including recent Zoom ones) to the end; was very involved with the Mothers Union; and was a regular contributor at parish meetings.

Most important for her was St James Church, which, as Lay Chair of the PCC, she led forward, always mindful of the church's role within the

community. She inspired and led the annual Flower Festival, producing the short texts which linked the arrangements to the theme of the year; she created magnificent flower arrangements and baked a plethora of cakes, as well as taking responsibility for the plant stall, often sourcing from her own much loved garden. Her deep but unostentatious faith influenced all she did.

Katharine was ageless and very sociable; she appealed equally to young and old, always attentive, supportive and never judgemental. She was an accomplished and very amusing speaker, as WI members can testify, and her generosity and acts of kindness extended far and wide.

The messages of love and respect from those who came to her hundredth birthday showed how much she meant to all at a personal and village level. She enriched the lives of all who knew her and her spirit will surely live on in Dunwich.



Update from Stop Sizewell C

"Human Wall" Beach protest: Stop Sizewell C and Together Against Sizewell C are organising a peaceful protest event on Sizewell beach on Sunday 19th September at 10am. Come along and help form a human wall to show the extent our much-loved Sizewell beach would be buried under Sizewell C's massive sea defences. We will be working with Suffolk Police and Sizewell B to ensure this is a safe event for all the family. Likely duration will be 1 - 2 hours, with up to 1 or 2 miles of walking. EDF and water: At the end of July we learned that there were major problems with the supply of millions of litres of drinkable water for the construction of Sizewell C, to the extent that the owners of Essex & Suffolk Water had issued a "holding objection" to the project. EDF is proposing to bring in tankers of water (40 a day) for the first 9 - 12 months of construction and then install a water desalination plant. At the time of writing, EDF is running a public consultation, but we are shocked that such a fundamental issue is unresolved at this late stage and it further undermines our faith in EDF's planning. **Alison Downes**


